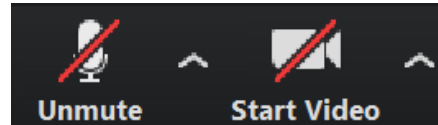


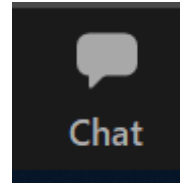

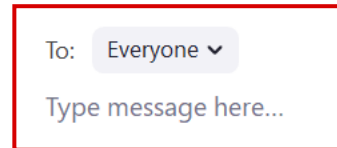

What questions could you ask to help yourself understand assignment requirements?

- How does the assignment relate to the course objectives and content?
- What are you being asked to do?
- What is the purpose?
- Who is the audience?
- How will it be marked?
- How will you structure it?
- What sources are required, and how will you reference them?
- What kind of language is needed?



Check for this information at the start of the study period

Feedback forms help in understanding requirements

	High distinction
Organisation	Clear introduction (including thesis statement), clear topic sentences, one main idea per paragraph, logical argument developed across essay, conclusion sums up main ideas in essay and restates thesis.....

Common areas assessed:

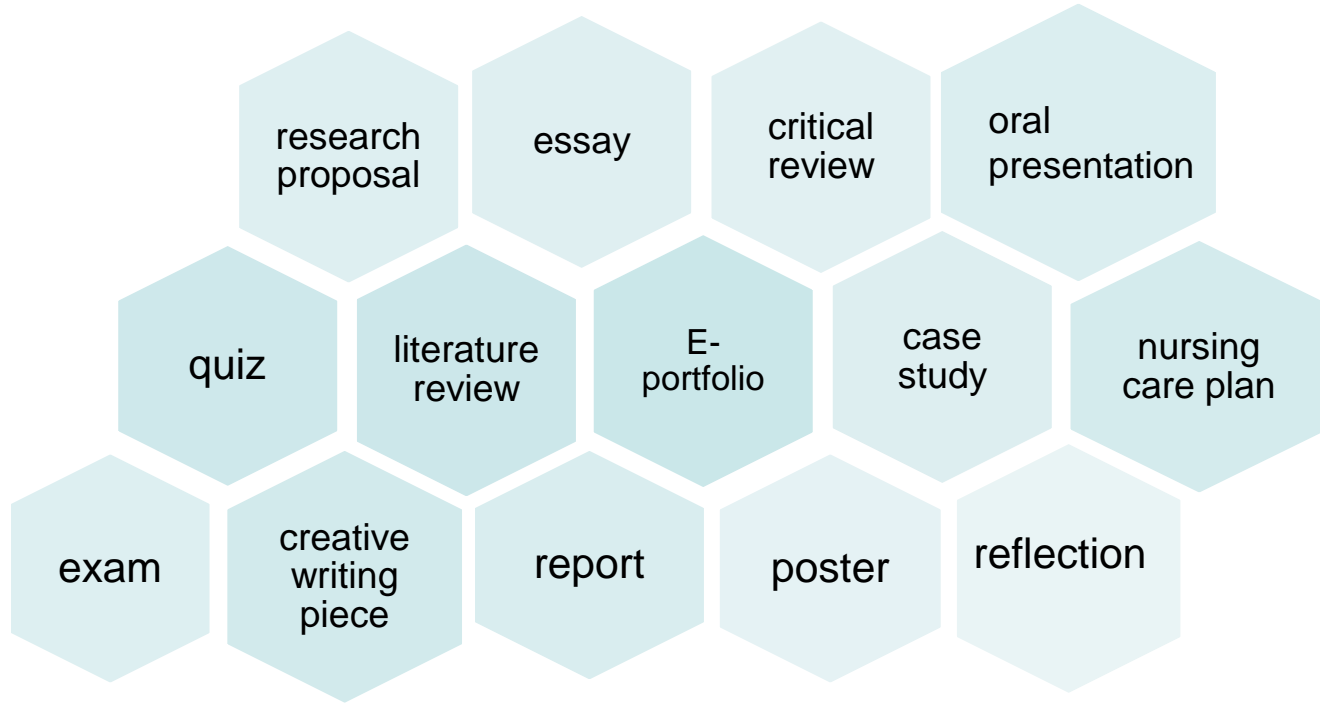
- content
- quality of ideas and argument
- depth of research
- referencing
- structure
- format/presentation
- grammar and expression

1. Check any **unfamiliar words**

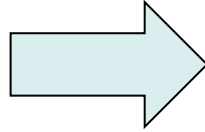

- **Understanding requirements**
- Planning
- Researching
- Reading and note-taking
- Organising
- Drafting
- Editing & proofreading



The assignment writing process is not linear, but involves back-looping (Marshall, 1999, p. 259)



Instruction words and their meanings

(adapted from Marshall & Rowland, 1993; Peters, 1985)

Instructions	Meaning
analyse	examine something closely in terms of its parts and how they are related to each other
argue	present a case for and/or against something
assess	decide on the value of something
compare	discuss two or more things in terms of their similarities and differences
criticise	give a judgement and support it with evidence
define	make clear what is meant by something; or use a definition(s) to explore a concept
describe	present a detailed account of something
discuss	offer some interpretation or evaluation of something; present a judgment on the value of arguments for and against something
enumerate	give an item by item account of something
evaluate	form a judgment about the value of something
examine	inspect something in detail and investigate the implications
explain	make clear the details of something; show the reason for, or underlying cause of, or the means by which something occurs
illustrate	offer an example(s) to show how or that something happens; explain a concept by giving examples
interpret	make clear the meaning of something and its implications
