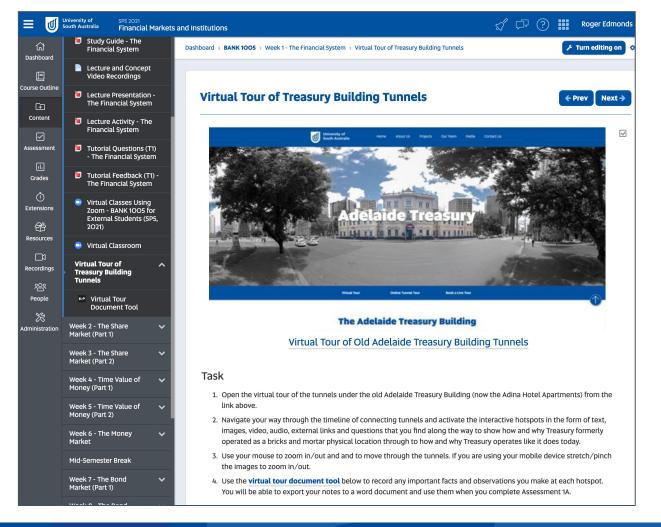

- Head mounted displays (VR)

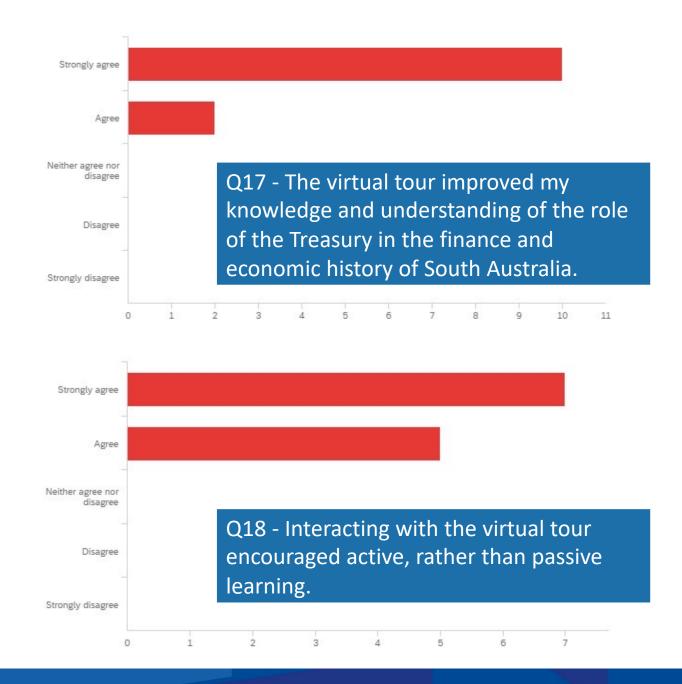


Evaluation (qualitative)

- Focus groups (late Nov 2021)



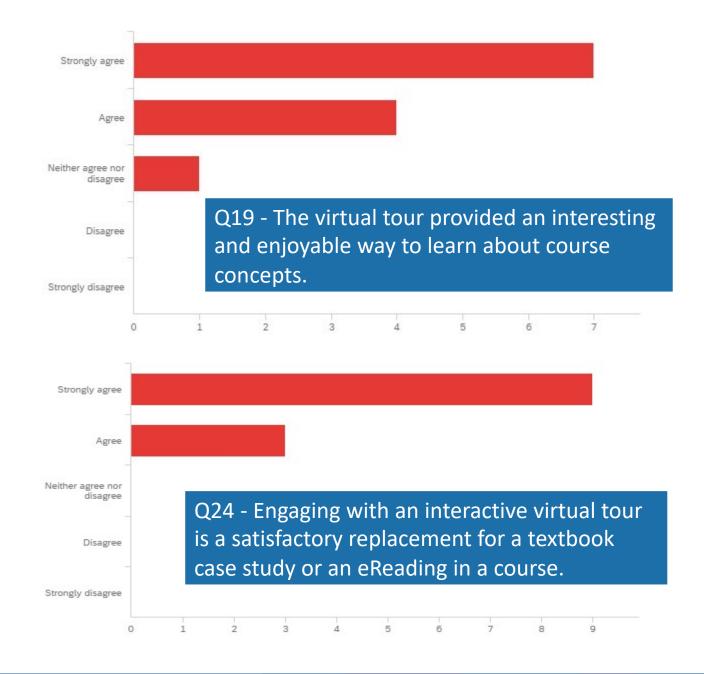

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Conclusions (from pilot study)

- There is qualitative evidence of improved engagement and understanding of concepts as a result of students engaging with the virtual tour.
- Students enjoyed 'visiting' a location they would not normally access
- Students preferred learning through a virtual tour than reading an equivalent case study in a textbook
- Students enjoyed the active learning pedagogy associated with the virtual tour
- The project has been an exemplar as a model for collaboration between the University of South Australia and external stakeholders



Recommendations (from stakeholders and students)

- Integrate and evaluate VT in other UniSA courses (e.g. Economics, Australian History)
- Create a postcard (with QR Code) version for Adina Hotel guests
- Promote use in high schools (learning + promotion of UniSA)
- Use in induction for Department of SA Treasury & Finance staff
- Create additional H5P interactives and embed into VT
- Promote the VR experience of the VT
- Use VT to inform the development of a wider 'learning in a virtual environment' framework for UniSA staff
