DEFINITIONS:Subject Area and Catalogue NumberClass NumberEnrolment ClassRelated ClassesAuto Enrol ClassExternal Class	A 4-letter subject area code plus a 4-digit catalogue number make up the course code, e.g. BIOL 1033 . You can search for courses by using this code. A class number is a unique number used to identify individual classes held during a specified study period. You can use class numbers to enrol, starting with the class number of the enrolment class. An Enrolment Class is the first class you enrol in for a particular course. This can be a lecture (LEC), tutorial (TUT), workshop (WSH), practical (PRA) or external (EXT). There may be multiple enrolment classes to choose between. All other classes will be related to the enrolment class and will display once you select your enrolment class. Related classes are other components (i.e. a tutorial or practical) that make up the course. In some cases you may be automatically enrolled into a particular related class that is associated with the enrolment class you selected. In some courses, once you select the Enrolment Class, you are automatically enrolled (Auto-Enrol) in a second (related) class (e.g. by choosing a tutorial you are automatically enrolled into the lecture). You may still be required to select another related class to complete your enrolment. The external class number will be listed in the Classes column below. This number is the only enrolment class number you need to enter in 'Manage my Enrolment' when enrolling.

Once you submit this, it can be approved, and this will give you permission to enrol.
