Rules

- 1. Credit will be given for this course on provision of proof of satisfactory completion of the Diploma of Medical Ultrasonography Part 1, awarded by the Australasian Society for Ultrasound in Medicine within 5 years prior to enrolment in the program.
- 2. This course requires all students to attend an intensive one-week workshop on campus. Enrolment is limited to 10 students.
- 3. Participation is required in clinical placements where students are required to physically handle people including lifting and supporting people with disabilities.
- 4. Student must be involved in performing diagnostic breast ultrasound examinations, including interventional procedures
- If the student is performing these examinations from the start of their enrolment in ICBR, with a supporting letter from their supervisor they can enrol in RADY 5030 at the same time as RADY 5002 prior to completion of RADY 5024
