

Scenario for Clinical Facilitator's Workshop

Topic: Communication & Comprehension (International student)

Blue shirt – student, Red shirt – RN/preceptor, Green shirt – Clinical Facilitator

Aim

The Aim of the scenario is to introduce an experience based upon a realistic and relevant situation in which a student needs to meet the assessment criteria listed in the NCAS tool.

The objectives of the role play are as follows:

- 1. Explore personal beliefs and values related to the presented scenario
- 2. Consider how you would apply the NCAS tool to a specialised environment in order for the student to meet the level of competency stated
- 3. Consider the role of the student nurse (including the relationship to NMBA national competency standards for a Registered Nurse) in the scenario presented
- 4. Identify and discuss the responsibilities of the clinical staff who engage with the student during the clinical placement in the scenario presented
- 5. Identify the responsibilities of the clinical facilitator in this situation
- 6. Identify potential strategies for managing conflict within this scenario

Scenario summary

- International student studying a Bachelor of Nursing program, and is in her second year of the program.
- The student nurse has just commenced her clinical placement in a local public hospital three days ago.
- First clinical placement was in a nursing home, which was a totally different environment from this placement. This hospital is a considerably larger hospital and it is very busy.
- The students are in groups of 5-6, with each group managed by one clinical facilitator who is employed by the hospital. Each student has a designated preceptor in their allocated wards.
 The clinical facilitator moves between wards to support the students and also receives feedback from the ward preceptors.
- The student's university clinical facilitator received a call from the RN this morning regarding her performance. The RN states the student is lacking initiative even after having been reminded.
- The clinical facilitator has requested a meeting with the student nurse to discuss her situation further.
